ENTRIES SENT WITH SIGNATURE REQUIRED WILL INCUR A \$30 POST OFFICE VISIT FEE. E-mailed entries will NOT be accepted. Reminder: Each horse/rider combination requires a separate entry form. Entry is not complete until payment is received. Checks will be deposited upon receipt. No post-dated checks accepted. Dishonored checks or declined credit cards will require complete repayment prior to the show plus a service charge of \$75. All outstanding fees must be paid before show packets are issued. No bridle number will be issued without full payment and completed entry, including signatures and emergency contact information. **Complete entries MUST include A copy of a negative Coggins taken within 12 months** of the show dates showing the same horse name as on the entry (GR906.4) All entries must include a signed copy of the USEF Waiver and Release of Liability . Entries with items missing at closing date are subject to an incomplete fee. Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis based on postmark or online entry date and entries may be limited. Those entries postmarked after closing will be accepted at the discretion of the show secretary, based on a space available basis, and charged a \$50 late fee per show. If the classes are oversubscribed, a Waiting List (in the order of receipt) will be maintained. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry. Entries may close early if time limits for judges are filled. Remaining entries will be placed on a wait list. Late entries, if accepted, must be complete and submitted by 11 a.m. the day before start of class. Late Entries will not be included in the program. Entries are limited to one arena. Send your entries early to ensure getting into the shows. Noncompeting Horses are welcome on a space-available basis. Owner must fill out an entry form with all release signatures, send a current Coggins and vaccination records. There are no USEF drug fees. Noncompete horses are still subject to and must comply with the Drugs and Medication rules and are subject to drug testing. Noncompeting horses must wear current issued bridle number when out of the stall. Noncompeting horses may only school in competition and warmup arenas after show hours. Conditions of entry Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show Management, Facility, volunteers and its Directors harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise. ENTRY INFORMATION USEF Membership To be eligible to participate as a rider, owner, lessee in the Open or Junior division at Federation LITE competitions, persons need NOT be members of USEF. However, Trainers and Coaches must have USEF memberships with up-to date Safesport Training (GR310) and those showing in the amateur division (AA) must have a USEF amateur membership with up to-date Safesport Training. GR310 Any individual acting as a Trainer or Coach or signing an entry blank as Trainer or Coach, must be an Active Competing Member of the Federation (USEF) and must have completed the SafeSport Training prior to the first day of competition. *Amateur Status If you are entering the amateur division, you will need to provide proof of amateur status with your entry. If you do not provide proof of amateur status, you will be placed in the open division. Because this is a USEF recognized show, the only acceptable proof of amateur status is a USEF Amateur card or EC Amateur card. USEF Horse Registration Those wishing to be eligible for USEF HOTY awards must have USEF horse registration and be USEF members. USEF Numbers must be provided to show secretary prior to the show for results to be reported for USEF HOTY. WDAA Membership To be eligible to participate as a rider, owner, lessee in the Open or Junior division at Federation LITE competitions, persons need NOT be members of WDAA. Class Division Explanations Riders are eligible to compete as Jr (Juniors) if they are 17 years of age or less at the beginning of the 2024 competition year (December 1, 2024 – November 30, 2025.) Individuals are eligible to compete as *AA (Adult Amateur) from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22 and must hold current USEF Amateur card. Open - A division that is open to all. There are no restrictions based on the horse (age, sex, size, residence or membership of owner) or rider (age, experience, qualifications, sex, residence, etc.) USEF SAFESPORT TRAINING REQUIREMENTS TO COMPETE Effective January 1, 2019, every USEF adult member (18 & older) with an active senior competing membership must complete USEF's Safe Sport Training, overseen by the U.S. Center for SafeSport. An adult member may be OWNER, RIDER, TRAINER and/or COACH. Adult members listed on the entry must complete the entire course and be Safe Sport Trained before the first day of competition. Safe Sport Training must be completed by all adult members on the entry or the rider will not be allowed to compete. You may access the Safe Sport modules from your USEF member dashboard at www.USEF.org. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules and of the current USEF/WDAA rules will be judged in accordance therewith. HORSE/RIDER MEMBERSHIPS and SAFE SPORT

ALL Horses on property must be registered and have a number

Ride times will be available on Wednesday before the show. Horses not competing but on the show grounds must be entered as a non-competing horse and have a number. Non-competing horse fee includes office and the grounds/haul-in fee. Please provide a copy Rider/Owner/Horse cards with entry for processing, if you have them. STABLING/STALL FEE: \$75.00 for overnight (Fri 3pm /Sat) includes stall bedded with regular barn shavings. All stabling available after 3 PM the day before the show. GROUNDS/HAUL-IN FEE: \$25.00 per horse (if not stabled). Mandatory: ASTM approved helmets are MANDATORY for ALL RIDERS on show grounds. Ribbons: 1-6 in each class. **Due to the poor delivery times of the postal service, mailed entries must be RECEIVED by closing date. Entries can be snail mailed to Amy Rothe-Hietter South Wind Stables 6475 Refugee Rd SW Etna, OH 43062 A negative Coggins test is required for horses entering the grounds of USEF licensed competitions, including USEF lite competitions.

Lite competitions are also held to abide by GR 845. This rule states that both Equine Influenza and Equine Herpesvirus vaccines and a negative coggins test are required and that documentation for both is required within six months prior to entering the stables.

Protective headgear is required for ALL riders.

Rules, Specifications, and General Information

This Horse Show is conducted in accordance with the Rules of the USEF. The official Federation rulebook will prevail for this show. Each participant in this show is responsible for knowledge of these rules and is subject to these rules. Any changes or corrections of the rules will automatically become part of this prize list. Questions that may arise that are not covered by the USEF rulebook will be decided by the Show Committee and their decisions will be final.

Directions to Showgrounds:

South Wind Stables is at 6390 Refugee Rd SW (between York and Outville Roads).

From the North: South on York Road, turn left on Refugee. OR South on Outville Road, turn right on Refugee.

From the South: Along I-70, exit 122 (Kirkersville/158/Outville Rd) Go north through Kirkersville, and turn left on Refugee (about 1 mile from the freeway) Go 0.5 mile and the big green and white barn will be on your right.

GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule

1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhino­pneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.

3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.

4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee. BOD 1/17/15 Effective 12/1/15

Protective headgear is required for ALL riders.

Stabling: Stalls are 10x12 and will already be bedded with the bedding South Wind Stables uses. Stalls are \$75.00 and are VERY limited. No tack stalls. (Entrants will either pay the haul in fee **or** pay for a stall.) Stabled horses may move in at 3pm the day before.

Helmet/Headgear: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tailcoat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hat-covers (where applicable) and must otherwise confirm to DR120 (see GR801).

Entries: Entries must be postmarked on or before the closing date. Entries after closing date will be considered post entry and will incur late fees. Mailing address is 6745 Refugee Rd SW Etna, OH 43062

Make checks payable to South Wind Stables No post-dated checks accepted. Complete entries must include copies of owner/rider/trainer/ coach current USEF/USAA numbers, if applicable, and a copy of a Coggins taken within 12 months of show dates. Entries missing any of these items will be considered incomplete.

Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis, based on postmark date and entries may be limited. Those entries postmarked after closing will be accepted at the discretion of the show secretary, based on space available basis and charged a \$30.00 late fee. If the classes are oversubscribed, a Waiting List (in order of receipt) will be maintained. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry.

Refund Policy: Cancellations submitted in writing by mail or email prior to closing date will be refunded, less office fee(s) and online processing fees. No refunds will be given after closing date

Arenas/Footing: The show arena will be held in an indoor arena with a small size dressage ring with sand footing. The warm-up will be the indoor and outdoor grass. Classes requiring a large ring will be held outside on grass

Schooling: Indoor ring will be available for schooling starting at 3 pm to 8 pm on Friday 23rd, 7 am on Saturday morning until the start of show, and in the ring during lunch. Other than this designated area, no lunging permitted in any of the show rings at any time.

THERE WILL BE NO SMOKING IN THE BARNS, ARENA OR BUILDING.

If you must smoke please do so in your vehicle.

Sharps Containers: Competition management shall place a minimum of one Sharps Container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one Sharps Container per 50 occupied stalls

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for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100.00 for improper disposal of needles and other sharp disposable instruments. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail.

Concessions: Concessions are not available at the show facility. No cooking permitted on the premises. No portable electric, gas or other type of heater is permitted indoors, tack stalls, or barns.

Dogs: Absolutely no dogs.

Hazardous Weather/Act of God/Accident Policy: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, acts of God, accident, or emergency. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, acts of God, accidents, or emergencies.

Schedule: Classes may not necessarily run in the order listed on the prize list. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the show secretary of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule. Management reserves the right to change officials, limit entries, combine or cancel classes, and modify the schedule, to modify or cancel awards and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Show management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of any entry for cause deemed sufficient by show management.

General Information:

Exhibitors are responsible for knowledge of USEF/WDAA Rules and Regulations governing the Horse Show and for their own errors and omissions.

All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers, (WDAA, USEF) for horse, owner, rider and trainer, before the date of the competition. Scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted towards national awards.

Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employers of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire, or otherwise.

The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.

Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit her entry fee and other fees.

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Show management reserves itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or schooling a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.

It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed, and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

Individuals wishing to post any advertisement or flyers to walls must first obtain approval from Show Office.

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF INHERENT RISKS: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with equine activities, including but not limited to horseback riding and equestrian sport, are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the propensity of an equine to behave in a way that may result in injury, death, or loss to persons on or around the equine; the unpredictability of an equine's reaction to sounds, sudden movement, unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals; hazards including, but not limited to, surface or subsurface conditions; a collision with another equine, another animal, a person, or an object; and the potential of an equine activity participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury, death, or loss to the person or participant or to other persons, including, but not limited to, failing to maintain control over an equine or failing to act within the ability of the participant; the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:

CAUTION: HORSEBACK RIDING AND EQUINE ACTIVITIES CAN BE DANGEROUS. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK.

Under Ohio law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"**), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("**Liability**") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E. COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding these issues and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions.

I HAVE CAREFULLY READ THIS DOCUMENT IN ITS ENTIRETY, UNDERSTAND ALL OF ITS TERMS AND CONDITIONS, AND KNOW IT CONTAINS AN ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE AND WAIVER FROM LIABILITY, AS WELL AS A HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION OBLIGATIONS.

By signing below, I agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time. Further, by signing below, I (as the participant or as the Parent/Legal Guardian of the minor identified below) hereby accept and agree to the terms and conditions of this Agreement in connection with my (or the minor's) participation in USEF Events. If, despite this Agreement, I, or anyone on my behalf or the minor's behalf, makes a claim for Liability against any of the Released Parties, I will indemnify, defend and hold harmless each of the Released Parties from any such Liabilities as the result of such claim.

The parties agree that this agreement may be electronically signed. The parties agree that the electronic signatures appearing on this agreement are the same as handwritten signatures for the purposes of validity, enforceability, and admissibility.

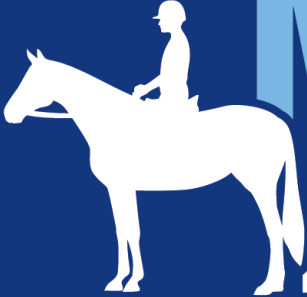
USEF Membership Statement

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; and 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USEF Motorized Vehicle Statement

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
